Day 1 - Wednesday, March 23: Depart U.S.A.

Tour members meet for our flight to Israel. After dinner is served, it's time to sit back, relax, and enjoy the on-board entertainment to prepare for this exciting adventure of a lifetime.

Day 2 - Thursday, March 24: Arrive in Tel Aviv, Galilee

In Tel Aviv, we proceed through customs and security and meet our agent who assists us to our motor coach. We then drive to our hotel in Tiberias in time for dinner and overnight.

Day 3 - Friday, March 25: Caesarea, Aqueduct, Acco, Mt. Carmel, Megiddo

Today we pass through the fast-growing towns and farms of the Plain of Sharon en route to Caesarea, the site of major events in the lives of Peter and Paul, and we will also see the Aqueduct. Afterwards, we make our way to the Crusader city of Acco. Then we continue to Mt. Carmel, where Elijah confronted the prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18). Then we visit Megiddo, before returning to our hotel in Tiberias for dinner and overnight.

Day 4 - Saturday, March 26: Nazareth, Capernaum, Church of the Primacy of St. Peter, Tabgha, Ancient Boat Museum, Boat Ride on Sea of Galilee

We continue through the rolling hills of the Galilee to Nazareth and to the Church of the Annunciation. Then we visit Capernaum, the Church of the Primacy of St. Peter, which is a Franciscan church, and Tabgha. Afterwards, we visit the Ancient Boat Museum to see a boat from the time of Jesus. We end our day with a memorable wooden boat ride on the Sea of Galilee. Dinner and overnight are in Tiberias.



Day 5 - Sunday, March 27: Mt. of Beatitudes, Caesarea Philippi, Golan Heights, Mt. Bental, Jordan River Baptisms

In the morning, we will begin our day at the Mt. of Beatitudes. Then we will journey north to Caesarea Phillipi where Peter confessed, "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God" (Matthew 16:16). We then drive through the Golan Heights, and, weather permitting, we will walk up Mt. Bental. Afterwards, we enjoy a St. Peter's fish lunch (not included) on the shores of the Galilee. This day alone is worth the trip! We are now literally walking in the footsteps of Jesus. Then we visit the Jordan River and a traditional baptism site where we will have time for baptism renewals (optional). Dinner and overnight are back at our hotel in Tiberias.

Day 6 - Monday, March 28: Mt. Tabor, Beit She'an, Masada, Dead Sea

This morning we visit Mt. Tabor, the traditional site of the Transfiguration. We then drive along the Jordan Valley to Beit She'an to see the expansive

excavations taking place at this ancient Roman Decapolis city. We depart for Masada, overlooking the Dead Sea, the lowest spot on Earth, where we ascend by cable car to visit the remnants of Herod's Palace and where in 73 A.D., the Zealots made their last stand against the might of Rome. We then proceed to the Dead Sea. Dinner and overnight are at our hotel near the Dead Sea.

Day 7 - Tuesday, March 29: Ein Gedi Hike (Optional), Day at Leisure at the Dead Sea

Early this morning, there will be an optional hike offered up to the Ein Gedi waterfalls. The rest of the day is at leisure. You can choose to relax around the pool or go for a swim, rather a "float", in the salted waters of the Dead Sea. You could also choose a relaxing spa treatment (not included) at Europe's favorite spas here at the Dead Sea. Dinner and overnight are at hotel near the Dead Sea. In the evening, our group will meet together to discuss the journey so far and our upcoming time in Jerusalem.

Day 8 - Wednesday, March 30: Qumran, Wadi Qelt, St. George Monastery, Bethlehem, Manger Square, Church of the Nativity, Shepherds' Fields, Jerusalem, Western Wall

We begin today with a visit to Qumran where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found in 1947. As we head to Jerusalem, we stop at Wadi Qelt to view the St. George Monastery from the overlook. Then we "go up" to Jerusalem where we will enter the city, as pilgrims did since ancient times, to fulfill the words of the prophet "I was glad when they said unto me: 'Our feet shall stand within thy Gates, O Jerusalem'" (Psalm 122:1-2). We will visit Bethlehem to see Manger Square, the Church of the Nativity, and view the Shepherds' Fields and the Fields of Boaz and Ruth. We then arrive at our hotel in Jerusalem for dinner. There will be an optional hike and walk to the Western Wall after dinner. Overnight is in Jerusalem.



Day 9 - Thursday, March 31: Temple Mount, Church of St. Anne, Pools of Bethesda, Pilate's Judgment Hall, Ecce Homo Arch, Via Dolorosa, Old City, Christian Quarter, Church of the Redeemer, Israel Museum, Model City, Yad Vashem

Early today we visit the Temple Mount, where Abraham was to sacrifice Isaac. We will see the Dome of the Rock and al-Aqsa Mosque that now stand there. Then we visit the beautiful Church of St. Anne and the Pools of Bethesda, Pilate's Judgment Hall, and the Ecce Homo Arch. We then walk along the Via Dolorosa, into the Christian Quarter, and see the Stations of the Cross. Afterwards, we visit the Lutheran Church of the Redeemer. Then we visit the Israel Museum to see the scale model of Jerusalem as it would have looked in the first century. We end our day with a visit to the Yad Vashem, Israel's Holocaust memorial. Dinner and overnight are in Jerusalem.

Day 10 - Friday, April 1: Mt. of Olives, Palm Sunday Road, Garden of Gethsemane, Church of All Nations, Western Wall Tunnels, Davidson Center, Southern Steps, Jewish Quarter, Cardo, Free time in the Old City

Today we take in the magnificent view of the Old City from the top of the Mt. of Olives. We then proceed down the Palm Sunday Road to the Garden of Gethsemane and the Church of All Nations. Afterwards, we visit the Western Wall Tunnels, before continuing with a visit to the Davison Center and the Southern Steps of the ancient Temple. We will walk through the reconstructed Jewish Quarter, walking through the Cardo, the original Roman street, and see the amazing remains of the

massive wall built by King Hezekiah. Then we will have free time in the Old City. Dinner and overnight are in Jerusalem.

Day 11 - Saturday, April 2: Mt. Zion, House of Caiaphas, Church of the Dormition, Upper Roon, Ein Karem, Church of the Visitation, Golgotha and Garden Tomb

We begin today with a visit to Mt. Zion to see the House of Caiaphas, the Church of the Dormition, and the Upper Room of the Last Supper. Then we drive to Ein Karem for a beautiful hike to the Church of the Visitation and the birthplace of John the Baptist. We end the afternoon at Golgotha (Gordon's Calvary) and the empty Garden Tomb. A special time is planned for worship, communion, meditation, and inspiration. Dinner and overnight are in Jerusalem.

Day 12 - Sunday, April 3: Church of the Holy Sepulcher, City of David, Hezekiah's Tunnel, Free Time in the Old City, Farewell Dinner

We have an early morning visit to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. We will then return to the hotel for breakfast. Afterwards, we visit the City of David, where we will walk through the Siloam Tunnel, also known as Hezekiah's Tunnel (conditions permitting). This water channel was carved beneath the City of David in Jerusalem in ancient times. Be sure to bring a flashlight and water shoes to walk through the tunnel. Anyone wanting to stay dry can walk through Hezekiah's shaft. We plan to end the Pilgrimage this day about noon, so you can enjoy a free afternoon in the Old City. This evening we will share in a Farewell Dinner and the presentation of a Certificate of Pilgrimage to each tour participant. Overnight is in Jerusalem.

Day 13 - Monday, April 4: Transfer to Ben Gurion Airport, Depart Israel. Arrive in U.S.A.

This morning we transfer to Ben Gurion Airport for our flight home. We arrive in the U.S.A. same day. At the close of an unforgettable tour, we take home wonderful memories of the Old and New Testament, a renewal of our faith, and a greater understanding of the life of our Lord.

Day 13 - Monday, April 4: Tel Aviv, Istanbul - Turkey

This morning we transfer to Ben Gurion Airport for our two-hour light to Istanbul, Turkey. Upon arrival in Istanbul, we will be met by our Turkish guide and start our day of sightseeing with a visit to the Church of St. Saviour in Chora. After St. Sophia, St. Saviour Chora is the nost important Byzantine Church in the city. It was built in the 11th entury A.D. The walls are decorated with breathtaking 14th century A.D. frescoes and mosaics. The mosaics relate to the life story of Virgin Mary and the life of Christ. Next, we proceed to the Egyptian Bazaar, he second largest covered market in Istanbul. It was constructed in he 1660's as part of the Yeni Camii (New Mosque) complex. The name lerives from the herbs and spices imported from or throughout Egypt. t is still the best place to buy Turkish delight, dried fruit, exotic spices, ind herbs. We continue to the Spice Market where bargaining is a must. At the end of the day, we enjoy a typical Turkish dinner at the roof top of Hamdi Restaurant with the breathtaking view of the Golden Horn and stanbul. Here, we can taste the various types of Turkish local foods and (ebabs. Overnight will at our hotel in Istanbul.

)ay 14 - Tuesday, April 5: Istanbul

After breakfast, we will be greeted by our guide to begin sightseeing oday with a special visit to the Byzantine Hippodrome, which was one of

the largest chariot race grounds of the Byzantine Empire. We then take a short walk to the Blue Mosque. Completed in 1616, it is a triumph of harmony, proportion, and elegance. The mosque was a part of a complex also including, tombs, fountains, kitchens, and a bath. The blue Iznik Tiles covering the walls have given the mosque its popular name, Blue Mosque. Next, we visit the St. Sophia, the church of the Divine Wisdom. The architectural marvel of all time. It was built during Emperor Justinian reign (537 A.D.), and it remained the greatest church in Christendom until the conquest of Constantinople in 1453 by Sultan Mehmet II who ordered to convert Hagia Sophia into a Mosque. In 1934, Atatürk proclaimed it a museum. Then we have lunch (not included) at Matbah Restaurant, where the food is prepared with the original Ottoman palace recipes discovered in Topkapi Palace archives. In the afternoon, we will continue our sightseeing with a visit to the magnificent Topkapi Palace, the residence of the sultans for almost three centuries. It is located on the promontory jutting out between the Bosphorus and the Golden Horn. The construction of the Topkapı Palace was completed between 1465 and 1478. Being the imperial residence of the sultan, his court, and harem, the palace was also the seat of government for the Ottoman Empire. In the Treasury section, we will see breathtaking displays, including the 7th largest diamond in the world, the "Spoonmaker's Diamond". The Harem is a vast labyrinth of rooms and corridors, once occupied by the black eunuchs, concubines, the Sultan's mother, and the Sultan himself. Time permitting, we will continue to explore ninety-two streets of the famous Grand Bazaar. The Grand Bazaar is the largest and oldest covered Bazaar in Turkey with more than 4,000 shops. A variety of Turkish Handicrafts, Oriental carpets, rare jewels, and inexpensive souvenirs - all sold in small shops next to each other. Dinner and overnight are in Istanbul.



Day 15 - Wednesday, April 6: Istanbul, Day at Leisure

After breakfast, our day is at leisure without a planned program. You could choose to revisit some of the places of your own, such as the Grand Bazaar for more shopping. For those interested, you could visit the Basilica Cistern, one of Istanbul's most famous historical sites, which impresses visitors with its 336 columns, each nine meters long, and two Medusa heads. Dinner and overnight at our hotel this evening.

Day 16 - Thursday, April 7: Istanbul Airport, Return Flight Home to

This morning we transfer to Istanbul Airport for our return flight back home. We arrive home the same day.

INCLUDED IN PRICE:

1) Round trip airfare per brochure, deluxe motor coaches, First Class / Superior First Class hotels, guided sightseeing, entrance fees to sites visited, breakfast & dinner daily per brochure; 2) Taxes and fuel charges totaling \$595 USD comprised of \$264.60 for fuel charges (subject to increase by airline up to 30 days prior to departure) and \$330.40 for taxes (including federal inspection fees for the U.S. Customs and Immigrations; international air transportation tax; agricultural tax; other per person taxes imposed by government entities; airport taxes and fees including the September 11th Security fee up to \$10 per person, passenger facility charges up to \$18 per person, federal domestic flight segment fees up to \$3.50 per segment and U.S. and International arrival and departure, and other government imposed fees up to \$300 per person); 3) Gratuities of \$180 for tour guide or cruise director, local host, driver, local guides, and/or ships' crew; gratuities on ferries, and cruise ships.

NOT INCLUDED IN PRICE:

Not included in your package are passports, visas, vaccinations, laundry, lunches, telephone, mini-bar, alcohol, other beverages, and food outside of the contracted tour operator menu as presented at a hotel or restaurant (these extra items will be billed to you before leaving the hotel, or restaurant), airport transfers on non-qualifying flights, porterage at airports, travel insurance, excess baggage fees, any fees or fuel surcharges imposed by the airlines after the date you register for your trip, and all other items not specifically mentioned.

PAYMENT:

A full deposit of \$500 per person is required at time of registration. Final payment must be made in the form of a check (credit cards are only accepted for initial deposit, any remaining payments must be in check form) and is due no later than 90days prior to departure. Registrations received after 90-days prior to departure must be accompanied by full payment. There may be a late fee of \$195 for all payments or new registrations received 75-60 days prior to departure. All tour prices are based on a minimum group size of 31 passengers for prices to be valid. If group size is 30-26 travelers, a \$75 per person supplement to price may apply. If group size is 25-20 travelers, a \$155 per person supplement to price may apply. If group size is less than 20 travelers, the tour may be cancelled due to lack of participation.. If final (full) payment is not received by imagine Tours and Travel, LLC (hereafter referred to as imagine) 60-days prior to departure, you will be automatically cancelled from the tour and your initial deposit of \$500 will be forfeited. imagine reserves the right to add a surcharge if the dollar declines by more than 2% against the shekel or euro based on foreign exchange rates in effect on date (05/21/20) when your tour was booked by your tour leader/church. All payments are required in US Funds.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

Price is based on double occupancy (two persons sharing a room). When available, single rooms are often smaller than doubles. While *imagine* will try to match roommates, we cannot guarantee one will be available. Roommates may be assigned as late as 60 days prior to departure. If one is not available or if you request a single room, there will be a **single room supplement charge: \$1595** for basic itinerary; additional \$695 for optional extension.

ITINERARY and CHANGES:

Because airlines often change flight schedules after brochures are printed, *imagine* reserves the right to shorten or lengthen the itinerary accordingly. You will be notified in writing when possible. If itinerary changes necessitate extra overnights, you will be charged \$195 per night/per person (single rooms \$225/night). Meals for extra nights are not included. Any changes and/or deviations from the program and/or departure city listed by the passenger must be provided in writing to *imagine* no later than 75-days prior to departure and any extra costs incurred will be billed to the passenger. All deviations are subject to a standard fee of \$150 plus any applicable airline fees. All tours are final at 60-days prior to departure. No changes and/or additions may be made to the tour after that time.

LAND ONLY:

Land Only price is \$3952 per person. Price does not include international flights. Land Only passengers may be responsible for transfers and/or additional overnights incurred by booking their own flights. We recommend you purchase a ticket which can be changed without large penalties, as the group's flights may change. Passengers changing from the regular tour to Land Only after 120 days prior to departure will be charged a fee of \$150 per person.

AIRLINE TICKETS:

In order to keep prices low, *imagine* does not guarantee you will be on the most direct flights to your final destination. *imagine* also does not guarantee the group will be on the same flights. Flight routings are chosen by the airlines and not *imagine*. Airline tickets cannot be changed or refunded once issued.
